


# Dennis C. Overstreet

Alpine, UT – Dennis Claude Overstreet, 77, passed away on September 3, 2015 at home with his loving family.

Born in Orland, CA on December 24, 1937 to Claude Harold and Angela Pearl Parlin Overstreet, he was the oldest of 5 siblings.

As his father was a miner, Dennis had the opportunity to live all over the Western US in his youth and attended Tooele High School and the University of Utah.

He met his sweetheart, Emmanuella Koncurat in Draper, Utah at Sunday School. They were sealed for eternity in the Salt Lake Temple December 2, 1957.

When he was first married he worked in the mines and would come home so excited to tell his wife about the things he had accomplished. He retired in 2006 to serve a mission with his wife in Suva Fiji. He learned to speak French and assisted families in New Caledonia in family history work. They served another mission on Temple Square and at the LDS Conference Center for 3 years. Dennis was also a temple worker at Jordan River Temple for 10 years and 1 year at Mount Timpanogos Temple. He had the opportunity to serve in many ward and stake callings which he enjoyed.

He is survived by his wife Emmanuella, children, Patrick (Evelyn), Nathan (Dacia), Selena (Orval) Dorius, Derek (Wendy), Sarah (Jay) Colby and Christopher (Mindi); 19 grandchildren; 7 great-grandchildren; and his sisters Jean Paulaskas and Amber Sullivan, and sister-in-law Harriet Overstreet.
